Dear Members,

The spread of the coronavirus (CORVID-19) as expected has impacted our bird plans going forward into the short to possibly mid-term future. In chronological order, through recent days: **Monday March 16**: The BSSA Committee cancelled their Murphy Classic Novice and Intermediate Show planned for Saturday March 28th including the backup date of April 18th, and cancelled their Tuesday April 7th General Meeting.

Tuesday March 17: The NEBS Committee cancelled their Wednesday April 8th General Meeting. The virus is highly contagious, affection at present is ramping up and is potentially lethal to those at the upper end of the membership age structure. So, the April meeting was deemed to be a non-essential social gathering, thus ensuring recommended social distancing as the primary deterrent. The club magazine will be published and distributed electronically or by mail as usual. The show schedules generally distributed at the time of the April meeting may or may not be distributed. Whether or not they remain relevant will be subject to ongoing review as the pandemic unfolds.

Wednesday March 18: Received the following notification from the Canary and Cage Bird Federation through whom NEBS is affiliated and takes out public liability insurance: "ALL bird events scheduled prior to 14th June 2020, including shows, sales and club meetings should be cancelled immediately". Their current advice is that their public liability insurance will not cover claims associated with the CORVID-19 outbreak. Invoking their advice would go beyond cancellation of our April General Meeting and rub out the May and June General Meetings, the Lloyd Edwards Breeder Show scheduled for Saturday May 9th, the Dominant Varieties MiniShow programmed for the May General Meeting and the sale of birds programmed for the June General Meeting. Progress of the virus will be monitored by the Committee in relation to this advice from the Canary and Cage Bird Federation and current and ongoing medical consensus among government bodies.

Imminent advice from ANBC and or BCV regarding the Bendigo National Show: This will be communicated to you as soon as formal notification is received via the BCSA. Note that as of today (Wednesday March 18) there are now government imposed restrictions on non-essential indoor meetings exceeding 100 participants, until further notice, which directly relates to this event scheduled for the weekend of May 23-24. The Logan Shield and BCSA Annual Auction is within the BCSA jurisdiction and their programming will be reviewed by that body in due course. The current crisis needs to be taken seriously so please follow the advice of the health professionals to minimise risk. This communication will be printed in the April magazine to reach those who are not connected electronically.

CONTINUED FROM FEBRUARY BUDGIE BULLETIN...... (Avian Gastric Yeast previously referred to as Megabacteria)

The Avian Gastric Yeast Experience

HUSBANDRY AND HYGIENE

Even though AGY has a limited survival time once outside a bird's body, good husbandry practices and strict hygiene measures should be undertaken when dealing with any sick bird. Infected birds need to be housed separately and basic barrier nursing needs to take place. Infected birds need to be cleaned, treated and fed last to reduce the chance of cross infection. Every cage/hotbox must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected daily so as to remove any faeces, vomit or regurgitated material. All items from the cage or hotbox, including perches, food bowls, plastic tubes/crop needles and syringes used to feed/treat infected birds, need to washed in hot, soapy water, rinsed and then disinfected after each use. Plant browse needs to be changed daily. At Kanyana we routinely use F10Ò SC veterinary disinfectant (www.healthandhygiene.co.za). Clean handling towels are used each time for each bird.

TREATMENT

There have been a few trials done looking at the treatment of birds with AGY infection (Phalen DN, 2005; Filippich LJ and Perry RA, 1993). Amphotericin B is the drug that is most often used to treat AGY infections. This antifungal drug seems to be safe and effective. Amphotericin B is a polyene macrolide antifungal which bind sterols, especially ergosterol in the cell wall of the fungus. This alters the permeability of the fungal cell wall leading to fungal death. Amphotericin B is not systemically absorbed from the gastrointestinal tract after it has been given orally. It can therefore be given in much higher doses compared to the intravenous route. Many different dosages have been recommended.

At Kanyana we use a dose rate of 50mg/kg (as per Wattle Grove Veterinary Hospital, Perth). Phalen has used 100mg/kg, twice a day for 14 days but is now using 25mg/kg, twice a day (Phalen, 2014). On finding a bird AGY positive at Kanyana, treatment is implemented if the bird is not looking too debilitated. All AGY positive birds are housed in our Isolation facility. We have found that if a sick AGY positive bird is not treated, it will die. Birds that are emaciated do not respond to treatment and these birds are euthanased on admission. Experience has shown that if the body weight of a chronically ill galah is below 200g, the bird will die, so we have a policy to euthanise these birds on admission.

Kanyana uses Fungilintm (Amphotericin B) lozenges (Bristol-Myers Squibb) that are intended for human use. Your veterinary surgeon will have to supply you with a prescription to obtain them. They are given twice a day (BID) for 20 days. The lozenges are convenient to use when treating individual birds. Fungilintm is administered directly into the crop by plastic tube or crop needle. The lozenges do not dissolve totally in the added liquid. A 5 or 10ml syringe is then used to draw up as much of the medication as possible. A flexible, soft, lubricated plastic tube is then attached to the syringe and the medication is given directly into the empty crop. It is vital that the medication is given on an empty crop so all food needs to be removed at least 30 minutes before the medication is administered and it must be put back 30 minutes after treatment.

It is important to also weigh the bird daily. It is necessary to give supplementary feeding to these ill AGY positive parrots. We normally tube feed them 2 to 4 times a day (depending on their age and weight). Birds normally start to regain their appetite in 3 to 5 days after treatment begins. Soluvet (Vetafarm, New South Wales) is added to their drinking water whilst they are on Fungilint treatment. This is to ensure that vitamin levels (especially vitamin D) are maintained whilst the birds are indoors for an extended time with no access to sunlight. They are not given parrot seed or grit whilst they are on treatment. This is because their gastrointestinal tracts are very sensitive and bleeding might occur if they are fed any hard seeds and grit. Instead we give

them dove seed and rolled oats until they recover.

It is also very important to reduce stress on the sick bird. It is best to reduce access to the area they are housed in, keep the area quiet and cover the heated hotbox with a curtain for the bird to hide behind. We keep adult birds at 30°C and fledglings at 33°C. We do not give fruits that ferment easily like grapes or melon. We normally give AGY birds a chunk of apple and a piece of orange daily. Broad-spectrum antibiotics may need to be given to control any secondary bacterial infection if the bird is very sick. Probiotics may also be helpful post antibiotic treatment. A study by A. Gestier showed that treated budgerigars became faecal negative for AGY within 5 days after being given water medicated with Amphotericin B and cyclodextrin (makes the Amphotericin B water soluble). At Kanyana, if after 7 days the bird has improved and is looking well, a faecal sample can be screened for AGY. If no AGY are seen in the faeces, the bird can be moved into a larger cage outside of the isolation unit, but it must complete the entire *course* of treatment. During this time it must still be housed separately and not with other birds. Many sick birds spend the entire treatment time in the isolation unit. The faeces must be tested again about 5-7 days post 20 days of treatment. Depending on the result, the bird is moved outside to a large flight aviary or medication continued. Only rarely do we see a bird that is still shedding AGY 20 days post Amphotericin B treatment. In our experience approximately 99% of previous AGY positive birds are negative post treatment.

Treated birds may well relapse after release, particularly during stressful periods such as breeding. Whether they remain negative or start shedding the AGY organism after release is not known. More research is needed to ascertain if these treated birds are

cured or if they continue to shed AGY at very low levels. On average, previously AGY positive birds are released 4-6 weeks after initial admission to Kanyana.

A further question and answer from the proceedings of the International Forum as part of the 2007 ANBC Show hosted in Adelaide by the BCSA with comment at the end on the context of the answer fast forwarded to 2020.

INTERNATIONAL FORUM

On the Tuesday evening (29th May) of the 2007 ANBC Nationals held in Adelaide South Australia, a very interesting forum was attended by about sixty fanciers.

The forum panel were Marcel Buhler from Switzerland: Ricky Watts from The United Kingdom: Warren Wilson from New South Wales: Alan Gamble from New Zealand: Ron Pearce from The United Kingdom.

Question: Roy Blair from Tasmania. To Marcel - with Recessive Pieds these days the hens,

especially the hens we have, they have barring across the forehead. We don't believe it is typical flecking and I was wondering how you handle the problem. Editors Note: To the right is a photograph of one of Marcel's & Ron's Recessive Pieds.

Marcel: Barring is flecking. Most of the Recessive Pieds on the continent are flecked. We are in the same position with Recessive Pieds as most of you are down here with Normals. That was the same problem in the Spangle and the Opaline Cinnamon classes. The best ones are flecked and over the next five to ten years we will have to work very hard on our Recessive Pieds to try to clean them up. As Ron told you before it is the breeding process where you need to try to improve them. Try to select birds that are not to heavy flecked. It is selective breeding.



Ron Pearce: I have never bred one (Recessive Pied). My

partner (Marcel) breeds them. We have just had a big controversy in the UK over the past couple of years. Our good ones have been crossed out to Normals and we (our partnership) have some very, very good Recessive Pieds but they have dark wings. When you look at the Standard it states between 10% to 20% wing markings. Some of the birds far exceed that and we have had a lot of controversy over the past two or three years whether those birds with dark wings should be winning. They are far the best birds so you are not alone in having those sorts of problems.

I will tell you something that happened to me a few years ago. I was judging in Belgium and a very well known exhibitor came up to me and said "I'm a little upset with your judging Ron". Of course when someone who is eminent says that to you, then you think "what I have done"? So I said "well let's go take a look at your birds". We had a look and he said "this is a top bird Ron". I said "yes, it is a beautiful bird, but it has a slight problem, it has no tail". He said "Don't worry about that Ron". He said "Look at this bird over here – she is one of the best birds in the show." I said "Yes she probably is but there is a slight problem". He said "what is that Ron"? I said "It has no flights". He said "Don't worry about that".

Look it is like this, when breeding budgerigars the thing is not to turn out the bird with the biggest head, with the biggest body but no flights or no tail. The clever thing is to turn out the bird, a huge bird with huge head with flights and tail. No matter whether it is flecking, or dark wing markings on Pieds, whatever, as a breeder you have to balance these problems. The guy with the bird with no flights, well every single top breeder in England would have birds at home with no flights, it is epidemic in birds now that if you have birds with feather, you have feather problems; it is how you balance these problems. These are the birds you keep at home. The



birds you put on the show bench displays how you have actually manipulated the problems. How you have managed them.

As it happens this well known breeder asked me to have a look at his aviary a couple of days later and I understood at that point why he was badgering me about not putting up his birds, even though they were fabulous. 85% of his birds had serious feather problems. If you breed 100 birds a year and you have 10% of feather problems you can live with it, but if you breed 100 birds with 85% of serious feather problems then you are going down a blind alley. You will back into the wall. It is all about managing the problems.

You need to look at The Standard and if it says the birds should be clean, then don't accept people saying "but it's a good bird – don't worry about that fault". That is the wrong way to go. You have to breed the good bird without the fault and that is the clever breeder. Jo Mannes has hundreds and hundreds of wonderful birds and they are not flecked – they have not got feather problems. Every year he eliminates them and he has a wonderful stud of birds with wings, tails, and clean heads. It is all about skill of breeding birds to The Standard and it is as simple as that.

Editorial comment in the context of 2020:

Ron Pearce makes some very good points in relation to feather problems. We can all relate to feather problems (dropped tails, missing flights) with the national show now advanced back to May and as anyone with any understanding of budgerigar husbandry knows, too close to the main moult. Fortunately, these are mostly temporary feather problems and these feathers generally grow back in time. But if there are many birds with this problem and the feathers don't grow back then "Houston, we have a problem". As for the original question regarding Recessive Pieds, it is a numbers game to get the quality bird WITH the correct varietal features. Same goes especially for the other difficult varieties: Clearwings, Black Eyed Self's and Cresteds.
