EDITORIAL August 2017

The past couple of months have been a busy time for the BCSA with the State Selection Show, National Show commitments and the Auction. So it's timely to remind ourselves of the aims and objectives of the BCSA which are clearly defined in the constitution and available on the BCSA website. These are, in addition to providing rings:

- To promote, encourage and stimulate the breeding and exhibiting of budgerigars, including the improvement of existing varieties, and the development of new ones.
- To serve as the State Council for Budgerigars in South Australia (including Broken Hill).
- To cooperate with other governing bodies interested in budgerigars, here in Australia, and abroad.
- To affiliate with and act as the South Australian member body of the Australian National Budgerigar Council (ANBC).
- To invite and encourage membership of Affiliate and Associate Organisations interested in the breeding and exhibiting of budgerigars.
- To use the Standard of Perfection for the exhibition budgerigar as set by the ANBC.
- To establish, maintain and recommend uniform rules for all shows and exhibitions held by the Council and its Affiliate and Associate Organisations.
- To establish a panel of judges who are able to judge these shows.
- To accept a Code of Ethics for judges.
- To ratify recommendations received from the panel of judges.
- To recommend and / or co-ordinate on any matter deemed to be of common interest to Affiliate and Associate Organisations.
- To obtain direction and/or instruction from Affiliate and Associate Organisations on ANBC matters through their BCSA delegates.
- To hold an annual pre-selection show to select a team to represent South Australia at the ANBC Championship Show.
- To host the ANBC Championship Show when required.
- To compile annually a register of show and meeting dates of all participating Affiliate and Associate Organisations.
- To establish and maintain an exhibitor status register for all financial individual members or partnerships.
- To do all such other things as may be incidental to the attainment of such objects.

CLEARWING: Bird of the month for July

Clearwings are characterised by their back, rump, breast, flanks and underparts being of a solid and even shade throughout, approaching full body colour. The mask is free of spots. Faint markings are present on cheeks, back of head and neck. Wings ideally are of pure ground colour but the reality is that the larger exhibition clearwings have faint markings in their wings and have faint spots, the latter needing to be removed to comply with the Clearwing Standard. Green series clearwings are referred to as yellow wings and blue series clearwings as white wings. Tail quill is neutral, tail feather is neutral with ground or body colour suffusion and the primary flights approach ground colour. When Clearwing is combined with Opaline and Yellow Faced Blue we have a Rainbow.

The Clearwing mutation is autosomal recessive so only visible when homozygous. It is selective as to the parts of the body affected. The mutation reduces melanin in the outer cells of the barbs of those feathers that would otherwise appear black. Melanin in the inner cells of the barbs is not affected so the green or blue body colour remains as for Normals. This is the reverse of what we see in Clearbodies, which are genetically unrelated the Clearwings. Genetically, Clearwings are part of an allelic series (different mutations of the same gene) with Dilute (including Black Eyed Self), Darkwing and Greywing being the other alleles.

Clearwings appear to have emerged from Greywings back in about the 1920's. English Greywings were paler in body colour than the Australian Greywings and it was from the darker body coloured Australian Greywings that Clearwings emerged. They were derived from specimens with paler wing markings, being further enhanced by selective breeding to create the Clearwing as a distinct variety. Whether the Clearwing is a distinct mutation from Greywing or whether Clearwing was gradually selected from Greywings has been debated over the years and we may never know the answer because their early evolution in the aviary was never documented or widely discussed by their creators. If anyone is still alive who has knowledge of this we would love to hear from them.

Food and Feeding Exhibition Budgerigars

PART 1: Energy Requirements

The nutritional requirements of Budgerigars remain poorly understood, not a lot of research has been done, and many of the recommendations are based on the experience of individual breeders or anecdotal evidence of successful formulae's. Balanced food diets need to take account of the different dietary requirements during the life cycle, and specific requirements of the bird. For instance, breeding or moulting birds will have a different nutrient requirement to young or older birds. A typical Budgerigar seed diet contains between twelve and sixteen percent protein, twelve percent fats, and six to ten percent fibre and has a maximum moisture content of eleven percent. A standard Budgerigar mix consists of Canary seed, White millet, Pannicum, and Jap millet. The basic canary seed and millet diet will not meet all the requirements needed by exhibition budgerigars.

Supplementary feeding is a must and should be rich in protein: Birds consume more food in the winter to maintain body temperature; therefore, they need to consume more, or take in food that is richer in fats and carbohydrates. Any diet for budgerigars needs to contain a proper balance of carbohydrates, protein, fats, and fibre. Canary seed contains a larger percentage of fats, proteins and fibre than White millet, Japanese millet and Pannicum. The millets and Pannicum contain more carbohyrates.

It is not possible to calculate a Budgerigar's diet to include all necessary requirements in the absolute correct proportions. The analysis of seed and grain can vary from season to season and the location where it is grown. The following is a ten year average for seeds and grain grown in Australia. From this analysis one can see that the inclusion of linseed, safflower and sunflower in the winter diet is worth consideration with their higher fat content. Percentages below are per kilogram of seed:

Do we need a change to the format for the State Selection/Logan Shield Show?

The BCSA Annual General Meeting for 2017 was held June 17, preceding the auction. Two suggestions were put forward by a member of one of the affiliated clubs who was given five minutes to speak. These suggestions will be discussed at the next BCSA Council meeting:

- The first proposal was to change the format of the State Selection/Logan Shield Show to include Best in Status and Top Seven, in addition to selecting the SA Team.
- The second proposal was to make it OPTIONAL for entries in the State Selection Show to be available for SA Team selection.
- A supporter from the floor indicated that while an exhibitor may not wish to have their first placed bird selected in the Team they might allow selection of a lower placed bird.

The stated objective of these proposals was to increase participation at the show. Some BCSA members are thought not to be interested in participating at the national level, or don't want their birds mixing with other SA birds in the holding cages at the national show, or don't want their birds to travel, but want a show in addition to existing club shows where they can compete for status points.

The Editorial in this issue of Budgie Bulletin sets out the role of the BCSA, as it appears in the Constitution. In relation to shows, this is "To hold an annual pre-selection show to select a team to represent South Australia at the ANBC Championship Show". NEBS provide the staging without charge to the BCSA in support of this format and in support of the auction which is the fundraiser for sending the SA Team to the National Show. As with anything in life there are risks that we accept and manage and we acknowledge that there are some who do not, which is their choice.

There might be other options to satisfy those who do not wish to make their birds available for SA Team Selection. **Go straight to the last two paragraphs for alternative suggestions that would not undermine the integrity of the SA Team.** However, to understand the ramifications of the proposals put forward at the AGM to change the format, read on:

- The current National and State Show formats are designed to promote all colours and varieties equally, which is protective of the recessive varieties. Normals, Cinnamonwings, Spangles, Opalines and Dominant Pieds usually dominate the Major Awards at club shows.
- Since the purpose of the BCSA show is to choose the SA Team for the National Show it mirrors exactly the format of the National Show. That facilitates electronic transfer of results from the SA state show directly onto the national electronic entry form.
- A new show management system would need to be developed for simultaneously running a club format with the current state selection format, from the one data set of entries.
- SA sending its "B Team" to the nationals would be embarrassing for SA and for the Team Bird
 Carers. Currently entries to the State Selection Show MUST be available for Team selection,
 in line with Team selection in the other States/Zones where selection criteria can be found
 on their websites. These States/Zones are Victoria, New South Wales, South Queensland and
 Tasmania.
- Undermining the quality of the SA Team would be an insult to those South Australians involved in establishing the national competition with a uniform judging Standard throughout Australia.
- Consider a situation where a breeder wins at the national show but at state level a breeder who won the class but opted out of making their bird available for selection claims bragging rights for having a better bird than the national champion!
- Currently judging at the State Selection Show concludes by about midday, with a couple of hours for viewing the selected Team, presentation of awards and clean up. The Team is then taken to the holding area and accommodated during daylight.

- Alternatively, judging and displaying Major Awards by sex and status, taking that down, merging cocks and hens, merging statuses, identifying and removing entries not available for selection and rejudging the show to select the Team, displaying the Team and presenting all awards, would extend the show into late afternoon.
- Participants from the country with some distance to travel would be disadvantaged and discouraged by the later finishing time.
- Who would get status points? The first three places in each class, after comparing cocks and hens, or the first three places in the Team selected for the nationals, which would not necessarily be the same birds?
- The current format relates to a show that connects clubs with the nationals. Changing to an endpoint show might encourage breeders to bypass their club shows.

There are possible alternative solutions to accommodate breeders who want to participate in a State show with status moving points that does not require them to make their birds available to represent SA at the National Show. That would be to organise a state any age show. Those who want such a show need to make submission to the BCSA naming their Show Manager, Electronics Officer and remaining members of the Show Committee, specifying the show venue and rosettes or other awards, source of their staging and costings for the hall hire and awards. Those who organise and run existing BCSA activities in line with the current Aims and Goals as set out in the BCSA constitution are already fully committed with their existing inputs at state level, plus responsibilities at club level. Whether the Logan Shield trophy remained part of the State Team Selection Show or is transferred to an any age show might be negotiable with the BCSA. However, there is risk to the viability of club shows associated with establishing any standalone state show, as referred to in the last dot point above.

If all is required is greater access to status moving points, without competing in a State Show, then making points available on a graduated scale throughout the top ten at club shows might be another solution. The Future Champions Show organised by the BSSA is equivalent to a state show for Novices and Intermediates, so they are already catered for at state level. NEBS strongly support participation of its Novice and Intermediate members at that show and voted in favour of modifying the BCSA show rules to enable it to be classified as a show for status points. NEBS have twice made submission to our biennial co-convenor of the Unbroken Cap Show seeking agreement to redefine it as an open show to enable it to also qualify for the award of status points for its Major Awards.
