BLACK EYED SELF: BIRD OF THE NIGHT FOR JULY

There are now four self-coloured varieties listed in the Matrix: Black Eyed Self, Ino (Lutino in the Green Series and Albino in the Blue Series), Dark Eyed Clear (Dutch or Clear Flighted Dominant Pied and Recessive Pied composite) and Spangle Double Factor.

Similarities and differences are as follows:

The self-coloured exhibition birds are from the Green and Blue Series. The Yellow Faced Blue

Series in the self-coloured budgerigars are not competitive on the show bench due to their yellow body colour suffusion. They can only win if competing against Green and Blue Series birds of vastly inferior Type. That is how it has always been irrespective of where the Yellow Faced Blue has been located in the Matrix.

UPDATE ON BUDGERIGAR IMPORTATION AND TIMEFRAMES

The department is progressing preparation of the draft report for the review of importation of psittacine birds (household pet, non-commercial and zoo). The assessment has been complex for several reasons, outlined below, which has caused minor delay to the anticipated release of the draft report.

The review has considered 60 pests and diseases of psittacine birds and retained 16 of these for further assessment. Of these, at least half have been found to pose an unacceptable biosecurity risk to Australia. The department is considering what risk management measures can be implemented for these pests and diseases to reduce the biosecurity risks to an acceptably low level.

Risk management measures may include pre-export and post-arrival quarantine, testing, treatments and inspections. A number of diseases of biosecurity concern can be carried by psittacine birds that appear to be healthy, emphasising the need to determine suitable risk management measures. Any proposed measures also need to be practically and financially feasible for exporters, importers and the department.

The assessment is further complicated by the need to consider potential biosecurity impacts on a range of exposure groups including captive birds, Australia's unique wild bird populations, Australian poultry industries and humans.

Due to the complexities of the assessment and based on progress to date, the department expects to release the draft report for public comment in early 2019. If a change of government occurs around this time then the above will likely change.

Food and Feeding Exhibition Budgerigars

PART 7: The Budgerigar's Digestive System, Mineral Grit and Charcoal

The bird's digestive system consists of the crop, which is where food passes after being swallowed; the stomach, the gizzard, and the intestines. The crop at the base of the throat is a bag in the food pipe which bulges after feeding; it is in the crop that the first stage of food processing takes place by action of the saliva. The gizzard is a dark red organ with strong muscular walls which acts in a similar way to the stomach, churning the food up in a mush ready for the action of the intestines.

Mineral grit: is retained in the gizzard and, aided by the muscular action of the gizzard walls, helps to grind up the food. The grinding process will still take place without any grit being present, but not very effectively; which means the bird is not getting full benefit of the food eaten. A good quality mineral grit is essential in the budgerigar's diet. Too fine and it may cause compaction of the gizzard but it is also important not to be too course. Pigeon grit for example is very course and not suitable for budgerigars. To date: no serious or scientific studies have been conducted on the value of mineral grits for budgerigars. All recommendations are based on the experiences of individual breeders or anecdotal evidence of successful formulae. Mineral grit should never be considered as a source of minerals.

Charcoal: is a non-digestible natural source that aids in the creation of oxygen in the blood and absorbs toxins in the bird's stomach and intestines. A reduction of toxins means that the digestive system can work at its optimum, facilitating better food conversion. Being a natural part of every creature's environment, it is used abundantly by birds in the wild to reduce the effects of toxins in their diet. The addition of charcoal adds to the value of any grit made available to budgerigars and the birds wellbeing.

Water: Budgerigars need water for every chemical process of the body. They cannot carry excess of it and the amount retained is very small. Without water budgerigars will rapidly become distressed leading to gaping, panting, convulsions and death. A lot of water is lost in the respiratory system and cannot be controlled, and it drastically increases if the bird becomes distressed. A small amount is lost in the urine and faeces but it is regulated mainly by reabsorption in the large intestine.

One hopes that this series of articles has been of benefit to my fellow breeders of budgerigars. It is an accumulation of many years of breeding these wonderful, gregarious and fascinating birds, plus a twenty year involvement in the seed and grain industry specialising in bird seeds.


FLECKING AND TICKING

The proposal arising from the National Judges Meeting at the national show in Penrith in 2018 is that as of January 1, 2019, heavy flecking (as shown in the following photographs) will be disqualified on the show bench, with light flecking penalised (as with any quantitative feature on the exhibition budgerigar, the greater the departure from The Standard the heavier the penalty) with a view to light flecking being eventually eliminated some years down the track. These are preliminary pictures with the final presentation to be ratified by the National Colour and Standards Committee, so these should be regarded at this stage as interim pictures for guidance only. They are presented at this time to assist breeders with their pairings as we approach the breeding season.
