DILUTE: Bird of the Night for October 2017

Colour in Dilutes is pale green or pale blue, diluted from normal body colouration by about 70%. With inclusion of grey factor, they appear as a mustard yellow in the green series and pale grey in the blue series.

The Dilute mutation is recessive so two doses of the mutation are required for its visual expression. Dilutes can be improved in two ways. If you already have good ones then mate them to each other, breed them in numbers and then select the best of them each generation to keep moving forward. If you need to improve the ones you have then outcross to better Normals to create Normals split for Dilute. These can be mated back to Dilutes to get Dilutes in 50% of the chicks or mated split to split to get Dilutes in 25% of the chicks. The latter gives fewer Dilutes but improvement may be faster provided you can breed enough of them.

Dilutes are seen occasionally in wild flocks and were the first recognised mutation. A pale green bird amongst wild type greens stand out as different in the eyes of predators and are therefore preferentially targeted, thereby losing the protection afforded by the flock. Although visual Dilutes are rare in the wild, carriers (splits in hobby language) of the Dilute mutation in the wild are many hundred times more frequent. So in captivity with inbreeding, as was the case when wild bush budgies were shipped to Europe, this mutation was observed in the 1870's from the accidental mating together of two carriers.

By careful selection for colour (utilising genetic variation in the form of additional colour modifier genes) the Europeans developed the first Black Eyed Yellows. These were imported back into Australia in about 1900. Thus, the same gene of major effect underlies both the Dilute and Black Eyed Self.

Dilutes have recently been introduced as a separate class at the national show which has filtered down to club shows and has caused some confusion amongst exhibitors. Since colour modification is polygenic there can be continuity in colour from light yellow or white in the Black Eyed Selfs to 30% body colour suffusion in Dilutes, complicated by similar gradation of mustard yellow and pale grey in the presence of grey factor.

Another source of confusion is that Dilute is allelic and recessive to both Greywing and Clearwing so can pop out of matings between two greywings and between two clearwings. In such cases the wing markings are lighter than required by The Standard. Dilutes with heavier wing markings have been seen in Greywing classes much to the displeasure of Greywing breeders who produce genuine Greywings approaching full body colour. Dilutes generally can be separated from Greywings by their pale cheek patches and tail feathers. However, inspection of a large Dilute class as seen at the national show illustrates the amount of visual variation that can occur. Visual Cinnamonwing is not allowed in Dilutes.

Food and Feeding Exhibition Budgerigars

PART 3: Carbohydrates

These are natural organic substances that include sugars, starch and cellulose. They provide energy to the body. The digestion of a carbohydrate depends upon the complexity of its molecular structure. The more complex the structure, the harder the digestive system works to break it down to absorb it into the blood stream. Carbohydrates are the main and most readily available forms of energy and are called the storage foods, or starches, which form a large part of the budgerigar's diet and are found in high proportions in cereal grains, fruit and vegetables.

Defects in carbohydrate metabolism are common even when the proportion and types of these foods are correct. Normal utilisation depends first on absorption by the gut. If gut movements or secretions are not normal, regurgitation of food or diarrhoea may result. Carbohydrates may not be sufficiently metabolised due to the lack of certain vitamins and an excess of indigestible fibre in the diet.

Carbohydrate Content in Vegetables Recommended for Budgerigars

As far as vegetables go, some of them are rich sources of carbohydrates, while others only contain traces of the nutrient. Generally, the amount of carbohydrates in a vegetable is calculated when the vegetable is in its raw state. Sprouted or germinating seed or grain is the simplest way of providing birds with fresh greens. Sprouted seeds and grains are more nutrient dense as they are high in carbohydrates, proteins, vitamins and minerals.

Carbohydrates in the following list is per 100gms of vegetables: Beetroot 8gms; Broccoli 2gms; Carrot 8gms; Peas 10-15gms; Spinach/Silverbeet 1.5gms; Sweet corn 19.02gms.

Dark Eyed Clear: Bird of the Month for November

Dark Eyed Clears are now being revived by their inclusion as a class at the National Show. They are budgerigars of clear yellow or white over the entire body and wings ideally free from any markings and colour pigmentation. Some do however have the occasional coloured feather which needs to be removed for exhibition purposes to comply with The Standard. They resemble the Lutinos and Albinos except in the eye which is black without an iris ring. They appear to have originated in Belgium in about 1948, and a couple of years later in Denmark, from aviaries with Continental Clearflights (known as Dutch Dominant Pieds in Australia) and Danish Recessive Pieds breeding in a colony environment. They are thus a composite of two different pieds. The table below shows the pairings that can be used to produce the Dark Eyed Clear:

SHOW SCHEDULE FOR MONTHLY NIGHT SHOWS 2018

Class 1: Normals (Green Series, Blue Series, Normal Yellow Faced Blue Series & Normal Golden Faced Blue Series)

Class 2: Dilute, Black Eyed Self, Clearwing, Greywing, Fallow & Recessive Pied

Class 3: Lutino, Albino, Cinnamonwing, Opaline ASC & AOSV, Clearbody & Lacewing

Class 4: Spangle ASC & AOSV, Spangle Double Factor & Dominant Pied

Class 5: Crested, Dark Eyed Clear, Australian White Cap, Darkwing & Saddleback

Class 6: Bird of the Night (Double points, combined status class)

Classes include the four colours: Green, Blue, Yellow Faced Blue and Golden Faced Blue. Yellow body suffusion where present in varieties expressing Yellow Faced Blue will be penalized in line with the Penalty and Disqualification Clauses of The Standard.

NO ENTRY FEE. Night shows will be held where the Program includes a Bird of the Night.

Entries will be for Junior, Novice, Intermediate and Open owner bred Young birds rung with the current ring year or the previous ring year rings. Young birds rung with the previous year rings cease to be eligible as Young birds on **September 1 of the current ring year**.

Points will be accrued in the above six classes at night shows for both Young (January to November) and UBCs (September to November). $1_{st} = 3$ points, $2_{nd} = 2$ points, $3_{rd} = 1$ point for each Class and Status. Points will be awarded for each Class even if there is only one bird entered in that Class.

Best bird of each Status will be chosen from Young birds, **except for September - November** when best of each Status and Bird of the Night will be chosen from UBCs.

Bird of the Night will be chosen from Young birds, **except for September - November** when Bird of the Night will be chosen from UBCs.

Old birds may be exhibited at any night show but will be judged separately in a single combined Status and Class and will not accrue points.

UBC's may also be exhibited at any night show and will also be judged separately in a single combined Status and Class and will not accrue points or certificates, **except for the months of September - November** as per the above.

At the end of each calendar year the member with the highest aggregate points in each Status will be awarded a \$30 Trading Table Voucher. **To be eligible a member must show birds at a minimum of three monthly night shows.**

HOT WEATHER POLICY: If on the previous evening the temperature forecast is **above**32 degrees NO BIRDS WILL BE BENCHED Revised November 16, 2017

Combined clubs any age show – To be or not to be?

The NEBS and BSSA Committees have been in communication regarding the proposal put forward by Port Pirie Club as outlined in the Minutes of the November General Meeting (see elsewhere in this magazine). The proposal was for NEBS and BSSA to cease running their annual shows each year and replace them with a combined show to be hosted on alternate years by each club, as is currently the case for the UBC/Nest Feather Show. Each club would host this larger show on the year they do not host the UBC/Nest Feather Show.

The idea is good in principle by increasing competition in a show about twice as large as existing annual shows, reducing the number of shows each year by one and opening up the possibility of making available status movement points for exhibitors who do not wish to make their young birds available for state selection.

The challenge would be fitting double the number of entries into existing halls (estimated at 400-500 entries), catering for lunches for double the number of participants (rising from about 25 to about 50) and recruiting a separate show manager with Luke being completely tied up with electronics at a larger show. Sustainability at this level into the future needs to be considered with ever diminishing numbers of members available for Committee positions and for organising various events at club, state and national level. Currently, in addition to organising and running club shows, NEBS are largely responsible each year for the State Selection Show and the BCSA state auction, and in 2021 in the space of three months could be involved and organising and running the proposed combined any age show, the Lloyd Edwards Breeder Show, the State Selection Show, the National Show in Adelaide and the BCSA State auction.

A decision from the NEBS Committee about the proposed combined clubs show will need to be made at Committee level in January so please make your feelings known to a Committee member before that. Feedback was also sought at the November General Meeting.

Background to the proposal for an any age show is as follows: There was a proposal to accommodate those who do not wish to make their Young birds available for state selection for the national show, that the selection show be made optional for birds to be available for selection. Port Pirie Club put forward an alternative proposal for a state any age show so as not to downgrade the Young State Selection Show and affect SA's national participation. The proposal involved NEBS and BSSA running one state any age show on alternate years to replace their two annual shows. The Committees of both clubs have reviewed both the positive and negative aspects associated with this concept and both Committees are close to a decision. Requirements for running such a show cannot be underestimated, since the aim is for a show of up to 500 birds. To proceed the concept needs to be accompanied by a plan for carrying it out.

The Show Manager position needs to be split between electronics and floor management (or show coordinator) along the lines of the existing Young-bird State Selection Show. Luke would do the Electronics. Do we have anyone who could take over the floor management at this show? That would involve closely working with the

Electronics Officer by Inviting Judges, organising Stewards, planning the layout of staging, dealing with issues arising during the judging and supervising the de-benching at the end of the day.

Catering would become a challenge with up to 50 for lunch, and the health regulations associated with serving food so close alongside livestock in a hall full of 400-500 birds still needs to be investigated. Irrespective of whether we continue with a sit-down lunch or move to a takeaway style as at the Logan Shield is there anyone who would be prepared to take responsibility for catering for ~50 people?

We need new people to fill these rather than putting further load onto the few who are currently involved in running the existing club shows, organising and running the state selection show and the BCSA auction and taking the SA Team to the nationals.
