ANBC Minutes Abridged for Meeting 16/10/18

An E-Meeting was held on 16th October with Delegates from all states and zones and the following is an abridged commentary of all matters addressed and agreed upon by those Delegates.

President Neale Love gave an opening statement on the importance of Communications to and from the ANBC given that almost all motions to be addressed were as a result of poor communications in the past.

- 1. By-Laws at the last Delegates meeting only part of the amended By-laws were approved. All delegates agreed that the remaining By-laws as presented in May 2018 were in order and the amendments pertaining to By-laws 1 9. All states and zones in favour.
- 2. Constitution Update of this document was approved and has been presented to the Government for change. Thank you to Nigel Tonkin for his efforts in this matter to be sent by ANBC Secretary.
- 3. Australian White Cap for 2019 the Exhibition Class will include all birds displaying these features. ie all combinations will be accepted from states and zones.

The class will be the last judged while in place and birds are to be left on the staging for visiting judges to view before moving to their usual viewing position for the public. This variety will also be the ANBC Judges workshop for 2019.

- 4. Penalty and Disqualifications ANBC Judges were requested to review the current P & D clauses in an adjunct to ANBC Judges minutes. This review was attended and no recommended changes were assessed by the Judges.
- 5. Centralisation of the ANBC Shows several states are against this and rather than see this as an ongoing matter it was agreed that states and zones that may impact (Tas, WA and CNQld) are to advise in 2020 any change to current activities. States are locked in until 2021.
- 6. Motion from BCT That the ANBC endorses and approves the recommendations of the ANBC Judges Committee to change the Penalty and Disqualification Clause in regards to disqualifying birds to be deemed Heavily Flecked as per the pictorials approved by the ANBC Judges Panel. Implementation date to be no later than January 2020.

Motion passed with 6 in favour and one against, being Victoria as they had an opposing motion. Remaining two motions thus lapsed.

C & S Co-ordinator to now present these changes that have been structured for this review.

7. By-law 10 – Discussions led to the change of dates in the By-law to allow more time for states and zones to communicate with all within their areas.

All agreed that Motions now submitted for the 2019 meeting are to be in the ANBC Secretaries hands by December 31st annually.

ANBC Secretary will distribute one agenda by the end of January annually.

By-law 10 to be changed to reflect this and issued to all for acceptance.

- 8. Freight of Birds to and from the Nationals it was agreed that the ANBC will reimburse 50% of costs incurred by the states and zones from 2019. All in favour and seen as a good use of ring profits that benefits all. States and Zones to submit copies of these expense to Secretary for reimbursement. Host zone is not eligible.
- 9. ANBC Container ANBC will pay the cost of transfer of this container from state to state. ANBC has also commissioned a further two holding cages per state to be added to the container top alleviate the congestion with the increase in bird numbers for Australian White Caps etc.
- 10. 2019 Rings all states except for SA have received orders. Dates set by ANBC Secretary in the past still apply.

The Ring Officer Position is crucial for the identification of our birds and recording family relationships, which are fundamental requirements for a breeding program. First mention of a Ring Officer at an AGM was a Mr Ellis in 1975, one year after foundation of the club. There was a Ring Officer Report in 1978 at a Committee meeting but no name attached to that. From 1979 the Ring Officer position became a permanent listing on the Committee, elected at AGMs.

HELD: Kilburn Hall, 49 Le Hunte St. Kilburn on Wednesday November 14, 2018, at 7.45pm Normal proceedings were suspended for the night to concentrate on the entertainment ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- 1. Visitors: Welcome Barbara Fisher
- 2. Cost of the Christmas dinner on Thursday December 13th at the Buckingham Arms will be \$30 per head with the difference subsidised by the club. Note the change from the Wednesday night to the Thursday night. Time will be 7.00pm for 7.30pm. Tentative booking has been made for 30 people with payment accepted tonight
- 3. Christmas raffle books are due back with prizes to be drawn at the Christmas dinner. Additional raffle books are available if anyone wants more books
- 4. NEBS was successful in retaining the Shield for the UBC interclub challenge. The shield for the best bird by a NEBS member who showed for NEBS was presented to Michael Sloper. Congratulations Michael
- 5. Club has been notified that Alan Kett a former NEBS member and member of the NEBS Committee has passed away. Alan was well known for his excellent stud of Albinos bred on a background of Dilute Greys
