Eating starts at 7.30p.m. so be there early for a good seat. It will cost \$30 per head. SHOW SCHEDULE FOR MONTHLY NIGHT SHOWS 2016

Class 1: Normals (GreenSeries, Blue Series, Normal Yellowfaced Blue Series & Normal Goldenfaced Blue Series)

Class 2: Dilute, Blackeyed Self, Clearwing, Greywing, Fallow & Recessive Pied

Class 3: Lutino, Albino, Cinnamonwing, Opaline ASC & AOSV, Clearbody & Lacewing

Class 4: Spangle Double Factor, Spangle ASC & AOSV & Dominant Pied

Class 5: Crested, Darkeyed Clear, Darkwing & Saddleback

Class 6: Bird of the Night (Double points, combined status class)

Note that classes now include the four colours: Green, Blue, Yellowfaced blue and Goldenfaced blue (single factor golden faced will be penalized for colour)

NO ENTRY FEE. Night shows will be held where the Program includes a Bird of the Night.

Entries will be for Junior, Novice, Intermediate and Open owner bred Young birds rung with the current ring year or the previous ring year rings. Young birds rung with the previous year rings cease to be eligible as Young birds on September 1 of the current ring year.

Points will be accrued in the above six classes at night shows for both Young (January to November) and UBCs (September to November). 1st = 3 points, 2nd = 2 points, 3rd = 1 point for each Class and Status. Points will be awarded for each Class even if there is only one bird entered in that Class.

Best bird of each Status will be awarded a certificate and be chosen from Young birds, except for September - November when best of each Status will be chosen from UBCs.

Bird of the Night will be chosen from Young birds, **except for September - November** when Bird of the Night will be chosen from UBCs. Bird of the Night will be awarded a Certificate.

Old birds may be exhibited at any night show but will be judged separately in a single combined Status and Class and will not accrue points or certificates.

UBC's may also be exhibited at any night show and will also be judged separately in a single combined Status and Class and will not accrue points or certificates, **except for the months of September - November** as per the above.

At the end of each calendar year the member with the highest aggregate points in each Status will be awarded a \$30 Trading Table Voucher or a Show Cage. **To be eligible a member must show birds at a minimum of three monthly night shows.**

HOT WEATHER POLICY: If on the previous evening the temperature forecast is above**32 degrees** NO BIRDS WILL BE BENCHEDRevised January 2016

LACEWING – Bird of the Night for September

The Lacewing is one of the red eyed varieties that occupies position 13 in the list of Sections in the 2016 ANBC Matrix. It is a Cinnamonwing Red Eyed Self (Ino) composite. The two genes each carrying their respective mutation are located very close to each other on the same sex chromosome, so the combination of the two mutations inherited together is rarely broken by recombination during spermatogenesis. Conversely, the two mutations can rarely be aligned on the same chromosome by mixing Cinnamonwings and Inos, but this must have happened even rarely in the past to create the Lacewing. The block of two closely linked mutations in Lacewings is inherited together in the same classic sex-linked recessive pattern as Opaline, and as Cinnamonwing and Ino when these mutations are inherited individually.

The body is de-melanised so for exhibition purposes Yellow Face should be excluded from the Lacewing breeding program. That avoids severe penalty by judges for the yellow body suffusion for Lacewings that might be bred in the Yellow Faced Blue Series, as set out in the Penalty and Disqualification clauses of the 2016 National Standard. A Normal (as opposed to Opaline) background is preferable to highlight the wing pattern that gives this combination of mutations its name. Due to its Cinnamonwing component the Lacewing might be less prone to green or blue body colour suffusion than Lutinos and Albinos since the Cinnamonwing mutation also functions as a downward colour modifier of suffused green or suffused blue body colour. Nevertheless, the expectation is that Dark Factor or Violet Factor may enhance the yellow body colour of the Green Series Lacewing and the Grey Factor and Violet might best be avoided in the Blue Series Lacewing to minimise risk of pale blue body suffusion in the absence of Grey Factor. Opaline, which also acts as a colour modifier to dampen body suffusion, enhances the ground colour on the body especially in the Green Series Lacewing, but the downside is the negative effect the Opaline mutation has on the lace-like wing pattern characteristic of the Lacewings bred on the Normal background.

Apart from the wings, the markings on the cheeks, back of head and neck are cinnamon with beautifully soft cinnamon throat spots and tail feathers. Spotting for the show bench sets off the face beautifully in a specimen with width of head and directional feather. Cere colour on the Lacewing cocks is flesh coloured, similar to the Red Eyed Self, Fallow, Recessive Pied and Dark Eyed Clear. In summary, a beautiful variety bred by too few.

NORMAL BLUE – Bird of the Night for October

The ANBC Matrix lists the Varieties from top to bottom beginning with the Normal Variety at the top. Normals are divided into their four colours (Green, Yellow Face, Golden Face and Blue). Varieties below Normal can also be bred in all four colours, including Blue but Blue being masked in the demelanised varieties, right down to Crested at the bottom. Crests can be combined with any Variety and Colour above it. Blue is recessive to the other three colours in all of the varieties. Thus, Green, Yellow Faced Blue (the visual form of Yellow face) and Golden Faced Blue (the single factor form) can all be split for Blue.

Focussing on the Normal Blue, the blue mutation is recessive to the three other variations of the gene responsible for production of varying amounts of the yellow pigment psittacofulvin. Mutations totally suppress production of yellow pigment in the double factor Normal Blue and double factor Yellow Faced Blue. Both presentations look the same so are exhibited together in the one section, Section 2 in the 2016 version of the ANBC Matrix. The two forms of visual Blue can only be differentiated by test mating. The double factor Yellow Faced Blue (which looks Blue) when mated to Blue produces all Yellow Faced Blues (which are all split Blue). A full explanation on the basis for colour is presented in the May 2016 issue of Budgie Bulletin. Briefly, in the absence of psittacofulvin "we see blue and black in the feathers of the Normal (Blue) budgerigar because of the distribution across the body of melanin and barb and barbule structures within the feathers. The small feather barbs and barbules together with melanin embedded within the feather reflect blue light so we see a blue

bird".

What judges are looking for in the Normal Blue on the show bench in addition to Type is full intensity body colour and black markings on cheeks, back of head, neck and wings free from any intrusion of body colour or bloom. Ironically, it was this bloom (an almost iridescent intrusion of body colour) that attracted me when I first sighted large exhibition budgerigars when curiosity took me to a budgerigar auction back in 1992.

Interestingly the single factor form of the Goldenface in all varieties changes from a Penalty to Disqualification in 2019 since the colour penalty applied to single factor forms of the Goldenface has not been sufficient to eliminate them from the show bench.
