DARKWING: Bird of the night for September

The Darkwing in Australia goes back to the 1930's but few present day breeders have seen them. There are currently two breeders in SA that I know about with Darkwings and the best chance of seeing them would be in the Any Other Standard or Non-Standard Variety class in club shows. Currently they will not be competitive against the Australian White Cap exhibited in the same class but the White Caps are likely to have their separate class from 2019 onwards if accepted as a Demonstration Class at the nationals over the next three years, which appears likely. I saw a couple of Darkwing Cinnamonwings back in the early 1990's when visiting George Duffield's aviary and recall that they were attractive yellow birds with contrasting brown wing markings.

The Darkwing variety has an Australian Standard. Ideal body colour is yellow or white with markings on the back of the head, neck and wings approaching black. Cheek patches are pale violet to pale grey in all colour variations other than with the grey body colour modifier, where cheek patches are pale grey. Spots are dark grey or black. Tail quill is invariably smokey black. Tail feather is blue in all colour variations except when with the grey body colour modifier where it is black. Markings are darker on double factor Darkwings so the aim would be to express this variety as the double factor to bring out the best of its varietal feature. As for Black Eyed Selfs, body colour in Darkwings is more likely to approach pure yellow or white when combined with Opaline and/or Cinnamonwing both of which can dilute green or blue body colour suffusion that might otherwise be visible. The wing feature in the Darkwing is stated in The Standard to be clearly seen only in the Clearwing, Greywing and Black Eyed Self. Perhaps it would also be seen in the Dilute, given the relationship between Dilute and Black Eyed Self. Whilst the Darkwing effect is said in The Standard not to be seen in other varieties we do know that some strains of Cinnamonwings and Greywings have darker markings and one might speculate on how this comes about, but it is unlikely to be caused by the Darkwing mutation. Let's keep an eye out next year in the Any Other Standard or Non Standard Variety Class at the club shows for any Darkwings that might be benched.

DOWN MEMORY LANE Part 5: NEBS TRADING TABLE OFFICERS

Perhaps the position on the club Committee with the most direct and frequent contact with breeders is the Trading Table Officer. The following is a summary of incumbents since the club was founded in 1974 as described in minutes of the club's Annual General Meetings (AGM's). As found for the Show Manager position, it wasn't until 1986 that the position of Trading Table Officer was regularly listed among the Committee positions at the AGM. Lea Todd was on the scene back in the early days and told me that before him Ben Muller and Graham White were the Trading Table Officers. A Mr Charleston was listed in 1975 as having the dual roles as Secretary and Trading Table Officer but from then on Trading Table wasn't mentioned until 1980 Committee Minutes when Mike Swain was named and 1985 Committee Position recognised at AGMs from 1986 onwards. The following members are confirmed as having served as **Trading Table Officer** since 1986 when that position began to regularly appear in the list of Committee positions in the minutes of the NEBS AGM's:

Only 20 2018 rings are left TRADING TABLE REPORT: Broad range of stock available as usual BCSA REPORT: There has been a development regarding the way flecking will be judged into the future. The national judges at their AGM in Penrith at the last national show decided unanimously that the pictorials for disqualification we published in the August issue of the NEBS Budgie Bulletin be implemented from the 2019 showing season. Not all states have agreed to accept this. Subsequently, a new motion has been voted on by the national judges to at least salvage something to at long last begin dealing with flecking in Australia. That has led to a new pictorial depicting only the most heavily flecked birds that would not likely be benched anyway with implementation moved forward to 2020 with a review not until 2023 for implementation of any further changes in 2025, if any changes are then deemed necessary. Apparently, the original plan was too complex for members in some states and some thought it did not give enough notice! The new pictorial will be published in the Budgie Bulletin when there is confirmation (hopefully after the October teleconference between State/Zone delegates) of its acceptance by the states who objected to the original recommendations. In the meantime, the new pictorial which hopefully will be accepted for implementation in 2020 can be viewed out the front for anyone interested in looking at this. Bear in mind that flecking has been removed from the show bench in the other major budgerigar centres in Europe, UK and South Africa. But in Australia for next year its business as usual with flecking penalised as "heavier the flecking the heavier the penalty" NEW CLUB MEMBERS AND VISITORS: Murray Bray was presented with his 30 years of continuous

membership badge. He then entertained us with an impromptu discourse on his history with birds: from pigeons, to finches to budgerigars and then as a club regular
